Oct 24- school will receive the budget for the school year from the government. It will take a couple weeks for it to reach the school and then by Nov. 30, school has to return it to the government saying how they will allocate funds. Music teacher Ms. Zap has become First Nations/Inuit/Metis representative and teachers throughout Alberta have been asked to include Indigenous learning in their classrooms. How is it dealt with when students need more help? • Carol responds. E.A's are funded through the district. They look at the profile for students at the schools as well as who are funded. There is no budget at the school to hire E.A.'s so it is done at district level. School's can advocate on behalf of studetns and district will decide funding. It is usually tied to the September "count" of students. That number determines how much funding school's get. There is a dollar amount per student in elementary and junior high that schools are given as a budget. Most of the hiring is done in the spring or after the Sep 30 count. SouthPointe school does not have the funds at this time to hire more E.A's. • Ariane brought up childcare at the meetings. Can we organize our own childcare? • Carol responds that they will do some thinking on the matter. • Tanya White passes around a bully and suicide pamphlet mentioning how prevalent it is nowadays. Description of parent council executive positions

School Council Co-chairs

It is expected that the school co-chairs will be a parent of a student attending the school. The co-chairs should be able to work collaboratively and knows how to organize both programs and people. They should actively encourage others to become engaged in meaningful ways.

Typical chairing duties include:

- chair all meetings of the school council
- coordinate with the principal to establish meeting agendas
- ensure that the operating procedures are current and followed
- be the official spokespeople of the school council
- ensure there is regular communication with the whole school community
- stay informed about the school board policy that impacts school council
- comply with the School Councils Regulation by providing the school board with an annual report that summarizes the school council's activities for the previous school year, including a financial statement relating to money, if any, handled by the school council.

Secretary

The school council secretary typically acts as a recorder at each meeting and ensures that the minutes are prepared accurately to reflect the directions agreed to at the meeting. Meeting minutes are to be sent to the school office staff to be uploaded to the school website.
