On **November 26**, **from 6:00 to 8:00 pm**, APEGA (Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of Alberta) will be running hands-on science and engineering activities and demonstrations in our school gym. As well, some of our SouthPointe staff members will have fun and engaging numeracy and literacy activities for all attendees to complete with their families in the Large Flex Space and Learning Commons (library) area. When you enter the school,

you will receive a passport that will be stamped as you complete each station. This passport will be your ballot to enter a draw for a wonderful Family Fun basket!

There is no cost to attend this event and you can come stop by any time between 6:00-8:00 pm. Students must be accompanied by an adult. Please use the doors off of our bus lane (Junior High doors) not the front doors to enter this event. All family members are welcome to attend and participate.



New Outdoor Learning Space

Last school year, SouthPointe School was supported with a financial grant from Shell Scotford to implement an Outdoor Learning Space during the 2019/20 school year. This outdoor learning space will help our students to develop increased awareness of our connections to and dependence on nature in ways that cannot be implemented in a regular classroom. This will be a learning center, a project-based station, and an area for observation, reflection and sharing. On Friday, October 25, we began the creation of this space with the delivery and placement of sitting boulders. These boulders have been set up in a circular formation, to honor Indigenous Ways of Knowing, just north east of our flagpoles. In the spring, we will begin phase two and plant a variety of plants, shrubs, and trees that are indigenous to Alberta and benefit the birds, insects and other life forms of these lands. These plants will teach our students about the sacred plants of the Indigenous Peoples in Canada, the uses of these plants as medicines, the life cycles of the plants, and how to care for the plants. The space will be a place of making cross curricular connections to nature.

We are looking forward to putting it to use! Big thank you to Shell!







WITS Program

Starting after the November Break, students in ECS to grade 3 will have the opportunity to learn about and use the strategies taught as part of the WITS Program. The WITS Program teaches children to make safe and positive choices when faced with peer conflict. The WITS acronym – Walk away, Ignore, Talk it out, and Seek help – provides a common language that children and the adults in their environments can use to talk about and respond to peer problems. Our School Resource Office will be visiting SouthPointe School to officially launch the program with a Swearing-In Ceremony.

Correction and Verification Form Reminder

There are still a number of families who've not reviewed the student Correction and Verification Form, which is available online through the PowerSchool Parent Portal. If you haven't reviewed your child's form yet, please do so as soon as possible.

Filling out the form is easy and takes only a few minutes to complete. Simply, review the form and each of its sections, make revisions where required, and then select "Sign & Submit," for the school to review.

The Correction and Verification Form replaces the paper version that was previously sent each fall. Every year, school divisions are required to give families the opportunity to review and update their child's information—including address, parent and guardian information, emergency contacts, medical details, parent consents and other related information. Reviewing and updating the form ensures the school has the most up-to-date information regarding your child.

NOTE: Parents or guardians who've opted out of having the Correction and Verification Form visible on PowerSchool, must contact the school directly to request any changes or updates to their child's information.

Inclement Weather

With the winter season almost here, we want to remind families to dress children appropriately for the weather when getting ready for school or the bus. The weather often changes unexpectedly throughout the day, so please select suitable outerwear and ensure your child is prepared for changing conditions.







If inclement weather conditions occur, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) advises families of any bus cancellations using various communications tools—automated-telephone messages, alerts posted on *www.eips.ca* and school websites, Twitter, Facebook, local radio stations and on Versatrans My Stop. Morning bus cancellations are posted on *www.eips.ca* by 6:30 a.m.

Decisions regarding bus cancellations are guided by EIPS administrative procedures that states, "school bus service may be suspended...when Environment Canada reports a temperature of -40 C." Other reasons for suspending or delaying school bus services include adverse weather and poor road condition. When school bus services are suspended, schools remain open to students. EIPS believes families have the right and responsibility to make choices for their children based on their beliefs and perceptions of safety during times of inclement weather.
