The returning student registration form will remain open until February 28, 2022. Kindergarten registration has also opened for the 2022-23 school year. If you have a child that is turning five before December 31, 2022, please complete the online registration form for next year. SouthPointe School is once again a closed boundary school.

Students who will be in junior high at SouthPointe School in 2022-23 will be provided with elective information early in March. More information will be shared with parents when elective registration begins.

For grade nine parents that have students attending Fort High for the 2022-23 school year, they are hosting a virtual open house on February 17 from 6:00-7:00 pm. Meeting code information will be emailed to families and will also be available on the Fort High website on February 17.

On Wednesday, February 16 at 4:30 pm we will have our regular Fundraising Association and School Council meeting. The virtual meeting code will be sent by SchoolMessenger on February 14. All parents are welcome to attend.

Kindergarten Registration is Now Open!

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2022? If so, it's now time to register for kindergarten. To register, simply complete the online registration form at *eips.ca/kindergarten*.

Complete the Returning Student Registration: February 1-28

Elk Island Public Schools' (EIPS) returning student registration process is now open. All returning students must complete the online Returning Student Registration Form to confirm their child's enrolment in a school for the upcoming 2022-23 school year. Additionally, students who want to attend a non-designated school need to make that request through the returning student registration process—acceptance is based on available space. All returning EIPS students are required to complete the form by Feb. 28, 2022.

To access the Returning Student Registration Form, simply log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal.

REMINDER - Accessible Parking


Please be aware that we've added an additional accessible parking spot in front of our school and the spots are located **behind** the signs, so be sure to leave plenty of space for those who require these spots.

Drivers are not permitted to park or stop their vehicle in these spots unless the driver has a valid Accessible Parking Permit, and it is properly displayed. The permit must only be used by the person it was issued to.

<u>Pink Shirt Day</u> - On February 23 students are invited to wear pink shirts as a demonstration to stand up together against bullying. This year we are focusing on healthy relationships and kindness. Positive experiences cause the release of dopamine in our brain, which is our feel-good hormone. Acts of kindness (a part of healthy relationships) help us feel good and therefore allow us to engage in learning and be the best version of ourselves!
