Parking

Parents, when dropping off or picking up your children, please use the parent drop off located at the front of the school on Allard Way or along the street on SouthPointe Blvd. **Please DO NOT stop, park or allow your child to walk through the bus lanes at any time.** We also ask parents not to park in the accessible stalls at the front of the school or in the staff parking lot. Thank you for modeling safety and respect in this manner.

Drop Off and Pick Up

All students should be using their designated doors to enter and exit the school at the beginning and end of the school day. If your child arrives after 8:15 a.m., please send them through the main entrance doors (located on Allard Way) as all other doors are locked after this time. They will have to come through the office to sign in before going to class. Picking up your child early? Please let the teacher and the office know in advance. Once you are here, you can call the office at 780-998-2747 and we will send your child out or you can come into the main office. Thank you for continuing to sign in at the office if you are at the school for an appointment.

Update your PowerSchool information

The EIPS Correction and Verification Form is now available online through your [PowerSchool Parent Portal](#). Use the form to access and update your child's records information—including address, parent and guardian information, emergency contacts and medical information. Reviewing the form and submitting updates ensures the school has the most up-to-date information regarding your child.

When reviewing the form, pay close attention to all listed phone numbers, email addresses and emergency contact information. Also, if you recently moved, now is the time to ensure the Division has your updated address. Throughout the year, the Division and school uses the listed information to communicate with families about important information, including updates, the latest news and event.

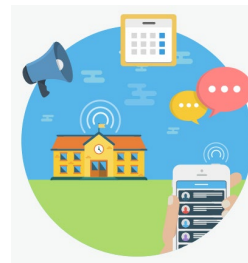

Download the SchoolMessenger App

SouthPointe School and the Division use the SchoolMessenger platform for communicating with families—through both phone and email. Be sure to add communications@eips.ca and general.sps@eips.ca to your safe sender list to avoid having important messages funneled into your junk mail folder.

The easiest way to stay connected is to download the SchoolMessenger app. Get the latest updates direct to your mobile device and enable push notifications to never miss a message. Families can also check back on past messages—for up to 30 days—directly in the app rather than searching to find an old message buried in your inbox. Download the SchoolMessenger app from the [App Store](#) or [Google Play](#) today.



Coming soon—the Safe Arrivals absence reporting tool will be rolled out within the SchoolMessenger app later this school year. Families will be able to quickly and easily report a child’s absence directly in the app. No more phone calls or emails required. Stay tuned for updates in the coming months.

Pay School fees online!

School fee information for the 2022-23 school year will be posted on the [PowerSchool Parent Portal](#) in late September. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the [PowerSchool Parent Portal](#) and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay online using a credit card.

Don't forget to log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of certain school activities such as field trips, class projects, athletic-team fees and more. Additionally, junior high and senior high fees can change as courses are added and deleted.

If you're unable to pay your school fees, you can apply to have certain [fees waived](#) by submitting an [Application for a Waiver of Fees](#). The application deadline is Dec. 15, 2022.

Numeracy at Home

The benefits of reading stories to our children at nighttime have been shared countless times over, and for good reason. Reading improves literacy skills. Why is it that we don't do math with our children before bed?

Math Before Bed is a collection of prompts that can inspire mathematical discussions that you and your children can have before bed, at dinner, or anytime.



Each prompt on [this site](#) shows you and your child a perplexing problem. Sometimes there is one right answer and sometimes there are many right answers. The purpose of each question is to generate a discussion about HOW you determined an answer. If you find one answer, try to find another. You could complete one prompt a night, or many prompts.” Considering checking out this website and integrating math into your child’s bedtime routine!

Video surveillance and equipment help:

- ensure the safety of all students, drivers and property; and
- discourage destructive acts.

Regularly basis, EIPS Student Transportation reviews the video recordings, in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy (FOIP) Act. The recordings assist the department with monitoring student and driver conduct and may be used as evidence in a disciplinary matter.

Hour Zero Drills

Evacuation/Fire

- “Evacuation” is used when the fire alarm sounds. This alarm requires all students and staff to leave the school and go to a designated location.
- In some cases, this may mean only going outside and away from the school building until it is safe to re-enter the school.
- In other cases, students and staff may need to go to a designated evacuation center. Parents would be informed of the alternate location via the school’s crisis notification network.

On Alert

- “On Alert” indicates there is a potential situation OUTSIDE and most often it has nothing to do with our school (wildlife in area, severe weather).
- When an “On Alert” is called, staff and students are directed to their classrooms, when outside they are to return to their classrooms.
- Movement is restricted in or out of classrooms, normal classroom activities continue.
- Staff are “on alert” and maintain situational awareness and are prepared to execute further action if needed.

Hold and Secure

- “Hold and Secure” is used when there is an immediate situation OUTSIDE (in the neighborhood).
- All exterior doors/windows are locked, interior doors remain in a normal state and normal classroom activities continue.
- Keep away from exterior windows and doors.
- No one is allowed in or out of the building.

Shelter-in-Place

- “Shelter-in-Place” is used when there is an immediate situation OUTSIDE (tornado, severe weather).
- All doors and windows are closed. Keep away from all doors and windows.
- All staff and students are directed to their designated “shelter-in-place” area.
- No one can leave their designated “shelter-in-place” area.
- Prepare for possible evacuation or “drop-cover-hold”.

Drop-Cover-Hold

- “Drop-Cover-Hold” is used when there is a situation happening to our building NOW (tornado, severe weather).
- All staff and students will drop under desk/sturdy table. Get down onto knees, curl chest to knees, clasp hands behind neck, put face down.
- Stay under cover with head down between knees. Cover face and eyes.
- Hold onto desk or table. Prepare for possible evacuation.

Lockdown

- “Lockdown” is used when there is a situation happening INSIDE the building.
- All staff and students are directed to closest lockdown zone/room. Lock and secure all doors and windows.
- Take cover, keep away from all doors and windows, stay out of sight lines.
- Do not allow anyone in or out of rooms.
