Candle Day

EIPS is hosting a Candle Day event this **Thursday, March 23**. Elder Wilson will be there as well as students from some schools and other invited guests. We wish to thank the schools who offered to take part in what will be an important day. We are also grateful to Salisbury for hosting the event.

The original event was set to take place in 2020, however, Covid appeared four days prior which resulted in the event's postponement.

The idea of Candle Day stems from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's hearings, which took place in seven cities throughout Canada. Each of the cities represented one of the Seven Sacred Teachings, which many of our schools have embraced as part of their school cultures. Elder Wilson has shared with us that at the end of each event, cupcakes with candles would be brought out in recognition of the fact that children at residential schools never had a birthday acknowledgement, and even further, were never celebrated in any of the ways that children should. This was particularly impactful for Elder Wilson, and so he wanted to create a day to celebrate the spirit of children and honour residential school survivors through the concept of birthdays and cupcakes.
