
SouthPointe Night of Music

Math at Home - Parent's Corner

Why is numeracy so important? (NewLearnAlberta) "Every day we are presented with quantitative or spatial information that we need to interpret and use to make sense of our world. We rely on our numeracy skills to compare costs, get to a destination, judge distances, fit objects into a limited space, interpret a chart or adapt a recipe. In school, numeracy, along with literacy, enables students to make meaning of the things they are learning in subjects like math, language arts, science and social studies."

Caregiver Series: April Sessions

Alberta Health Services offers free online programming for parents and caregivers of children and youth. Sessions are offered through Zoom. Upcoming topics include understanding anxiety, substance use, and building executive functioning skills. In these Lunch & Learn webinars, the discussion on executive functioning skills involves ways to support the development of your child's working memory, inhibition, and mental flexibility. The webinars on anxiety will explore how anxiety can lead to negative thoughts and thinking traps that can hold us back and how to move toward more realistic thinking. The anxiety webinars will also discuss how avoidance of stressors can increase our stress response over time and how we can manage stressful situations in steps using effective coping skills. Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) is currently reviewing and updating all parent and guardian contact information within the Division's student information system. This one-time, full-scale review is to ensure the Division has complete and accurate data on file as Alberta Education moves to a new way of capturing information in the provincial database.
