February's Hot Lunch will be from The Canadian Brewhouse.



FORT HIGH GRADE 10 HONOURS PROGRAM

The Honours program at Fort High is an enriched program designed for high achieving students who are motivated, responsible, and serious about their academic success. This program encourages students to extend themselves beyond the minimal requirements of the regular academic course program. Students enrolling in this program should possess a strong passion for the course content and demonstrate exemplary behaviour and work habits.

The Grade 10 Honours program offers a well-rounded education that satisfies the Grade 10 curriculum, while offering more complexity and deeper discussion to prepare students for Grade 11 and 12 academic successes. Assessment for the Grade 10 Honours courses will be the same as the regular grade 10 academic courses (Math 10C, Science 10, English Language Arts 10-1, Social Studies 10-1)

Students will enjoy the benefits of stimulating intellectual and social interaction in a supportive, stimulating, and inviting school community. With distinction and commitment, the Honours program horizontally extends the regular curricular objectives with a focus on higher-level reasoning, critical thinking skills, inquiry-based learning, links to other disciplines, and optional subject matter.

Prerequisite: Students who are thinking of applying to the FHS Honours program for Grade 10 should have their core average in Grade 9 at 80% or higher at the time of application. The top 30 applicants in the program receive enrichment course content in all the core subjects: Math, Science, English Language Arts, and Social Studies. The actual admission average may fluctuate depending on the number of applicants.

Proposed Schedule:

Semester 1 courses: Math 10C / Science 10 / CALM & Physical Education / Option

Semester 2 courses: English Language Arts 10-1 / Social Studies 10-1 / Biology 20 / Option

Rationale: By taking Biology 20 in Grade 10, it allows more flexibility to take all three sciences throughout high school. Physics 20 and Chemistry 20 are recommended to take in Grade 11; this will then open the possibility of taking Biology 30 in Grade 11. Taking the accelerated approach will allow the students to fit Math 31 into their schedules in Grade 12.

Kindergarten Registration is Now Open!

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2024? If so, it's now time to register for kindergarten. To register, simply complete the online registration form at eips.ca/kindergarten.

Complete your Returning Student Registration: February 8-21

Elk Island Public Schools' (EIPS) <u>returning student registration</u> process is now open. All current students, except Grade 12, must complete the online Returning Student Registration Form to confirm their enrolment in a school for the upcoming 2024-25 school year. Additionally, students who want to attend a non-designated school need to make that request through the returning student registration process—acceptance is based on available space. **All current EIPS students are required to complete the form by Feb. 21, 2024.**

To complete your child's returning student registration, refer to the Returning Student Registration Form email you received from Elk Island Public Schools via Permission Click on February 8. Families will receive one email for each student. No log in is required to complete the form.

Complete the Alberta Education Assurance Survey

Once again, Alberta Education is surveying teachers, students, and families through its annual Alberta Education Assurance (AEA) Survey. The survey gathers feedback on the quality of education provided by school authorities and their schools, which they then use to help understand how they're doing and plan for the future.

Throughout February, Grades 4 & 7 students at SouthPointe School are completing the survey online at the school. Student participation is voluntary and completely anonymous. Students are assigned a random username and password to ensure survey responses aren't linked to any individual student. The survey doesn't take long to complete and is done within the school day during regular class time.

Additionally, parents and guardians of students in these grades are also asked to take a survey online. Alberta Education has mailed families information about the survey directly. As with the student and teacher survey, it's anonymous and asks questions about your school experiences. If you have a child in these grades, we encourage you to participate. The survey deadline is March 1, 2024.

Results from the AEA Survey are provided to Elk Island Public Schools each spring. The Division then uses the data to inform its four-year education plan, school education plans and strategies for continuous improvement. Each fall, the results are also shared with EIPS families and school communities in the Division's *Annual Education Results Report*.
