

# 2024-25 EIPS Annual Feedback Surveys: For Parents and Caregivers and For Students – Results Now Available

The results of the 2024-25 EIPS Annual Feedback Surveys: For Parents and Caregivers and For Students are now available. In March, the Division conducted the annual surveys, which help EIPS gauge its progress toward meeting the goals and priorities outlined in its Four-Year Education Plan. Families and grades 9 and 12 students were asked a series of questions about their experiences with EIPS and their school, the overall performance of the Division, the quality of education being provided to students and areas for improvement.

Thank you to all families and students who took the time to share their feedback with the Division.


Overall, the surveys received close to 2,400 responses from parents and caregivers and close to 2,000 responses from grades 9 and 12 students across EIPS. The Division, and schools, will now review the feedback in detail and use it to develop new strategies to serve students and the wider community better.

# Counsellor's Corner... Happy Indigenous Peoples Day

National Indigenous Peoples Day is celebrated in Canada every June 21 to honor the heritage,

cultures, and contributions of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples. The date was chosen

because it coincides with the summer solstice, which holds deep cultural and spiritual significance for many Indigenous communities. National Indigenous Peoples Day takes place on the summer solstice, the longest day of the year. For generations, many First Nations, Inuit, and

Métis communities have celebrated their cultures, languages, and traditions at this time of year.

Originally declared National Aboriginal Day in 1996, the name was changed to National Indigenous Peoples Day in 2017 to better reflect the diversity of Indigenous groups in Canada. The day is marked by celebrations, cultural events, and educational activities across the country, including powwows, traditional feasts, music, and storytelling. We encourage all members of our community to take the time to engage with Indigenous cultural celebrations, be willing to learn, be willing to stand up for positive change, as well as reflect on the issues faced by Indigenous

communities.

# JUNE IS NATIONAL INDIGENOUS PEOPLES MONTH

Throughout June, our school is recognizing National Indigenous Peoples Month—a time to honor the cultures, traditions, and contributions of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit peoples. Elk Island Public Schools has prepared a variety of activities and resources to support learning and reflection. ### **National Indigenous History Month**



This month, some of our classes took a creative journey into the past by designing and building moccasins using rocks and other materials.

Inspired by traditional Indigenous footwear, this hands-on activity combined lessons in history, Indigenous culture, and artistic expression. Students explored how people once used the resources around them to craft everyday items—while putting their own creative twist on each unique moccasin model. The results were imaginative, gorgeous, and truly one-of-a-kind!



National Aboriginal Day (now National Indigenous Peoples Day) was announced in 1996 by then Governor General of Canada, Roméo LeBlanc, through the <u>Proclamation Declaring</u>

<u>June 21 of Each Year as National Aboriginal Day</u>. This was the result of consultations and statements of support for such a day made by various Indigenous groups:

- in 1982, the National Indian Brotherhood (now the Assembly of First Nations) called for the creation of National Aboriginal Solidarity Day
- in 1995, the Sacred Assembly, a national conference of Indigenous and non-Indigenous people chaired by Elijah Harper, called for a national holiday to celebrate the contributions of Indigenous Peoples
- also in 1995, the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples recommended the designation of a National First Peoples Day
   On June 21, 2017, the Prime Minister issued a <u>statement</u> announcing the intention to rename this day National Indigenous Peoples Day.

# News from EIPS

#### Accessing User Accounts: Students Leaving EIPS

Is your child graduating from or leaving EIPS at the end of the school year? If so, they must ensure any information they want to retain from their school cloud accounts is downloaded onto a personal device before leaving.

·Google account – Students must download any wanted content before August 6—download files either individually or in bulk using <u>Google Takeout</u>.

·Microsoft account – Students must download any wanted content from their OneDrive account before August 6.

After Aug. 6, 2025, EIPS will deactivate the account.

#### Pre-kindergarten Programming at EIPS

Is there a preschooler in your life experiencing identified developmental delays or challenges with speech-language—big or small? If so, Elk Island Public School's Play And Learn at School (PALS) program could help.

Early learning lays the foundation for success in primary grades and beyond. As such, EIPS offers the pre-kindergarten PALS program in five of its elementary school locations. Applications are now open for free speech-language assessments for those interested in registering in the PALS program this fall. The assessment helps determine if PALS is appropriate for your child. If you know a preschooler, born in 2021 or 2022, who could benefit from pre-kindergarten programming or want to book an assessment, fill out the PALS Program Request Form or call 780-417-8219. #### Notification Emails from your PowerSchool Parent Portal

Through the <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u>, parents and guardians can subscribe to receive email updates from the school and about their child, as well as the frequency for receiving the updates. These PowerSchool notifications are separate from the emails you receive from the Division and your child's school sent through SchoolMessenger.

In June, Elk Island Public Schools is updating the domain configuration where these PowerSchool emails come from to support more cost effective and efficient modernization of technology within the Division. As the updates take place, notifications may come from one or the other email address. By June 13, when the update is complete, messages from the PowerSchool Parent Portal will come from only the new email address:

We encourage you to add this new email address to your safe-sender list to avoid missing any updates you're subscribed to. At any time, if you'd like to update your subscription settings within PowerSchool, simply log in to the <u>Parent Portal</u> and click the "Email Notifications" tab in the left-hand menu.

# News from EIPS

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#### **REMINDER: 2024-25 School Fees**

School fees for the 2024-25 school year are posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. Throughout the year, fees are often added to cover the costs for various activities, such as field trips, extracurricular activities, and late, damaged or lost textbooks. To access your fee information, simply log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal and go to "Student Fees." There you can view fees and pay them online using a Mastercard or Visa credit or debit card. Make sure to monitor your child's account on an ongoing basis.

And, if you have questions, think there's an error or need help creating a PowerSchool Parent Portal account, contact your child's school directly before the summer break.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Pursuant to <u>Board Policy 23: School Fees</u> and <u>Administrative Procedure 505: School and Administrative Fees</u>, EIPS will forward any unpaid 2024-25 fee amounts to a collection agency. To prevent this from happening, remember to pay your fees before Aug. 31, 2025.

#### **Student Transportation: 2025-26 Registration**

Planning to use <u>Student Transportation</u> in the 2025-26 school year? If so, make sure your child is registered so Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) can plan routes and send your child a bus pass before the first day of school.

All students who indicated needing transportation services through the returning student or new student registration processes are now registered. Those families have also received tentative route schedules and invoices—fees are due June 30, 2025.

For those students who did not indicate needing transportation services during the registration process and want to now register, complete a Busing Setup form through the <u>Transportation Service Desk</u>.

NOTE: Families can pay fees online using the <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u>. To pay in-person, visit the <u>EIPS Student Transportation building</u> during its office hours—Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on school days and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on school closure days.

# Has your child had their annual eye exam? It's important to do before they start school!

#### Eye See...Eye Learn™

is a program that provides kindergarten-aged students with a comprehensive eye exam from an optometrist. There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19. If required, kindergarten-aged students also receive a free pair of eyeglasses.



Step 1 Parents can find a participating optometrist at optometrists.ab.ca. Click on Find an Optometrist and Eye See...Eye Learn™, then enter your postal code to find a doctor close to you. Call and book an appointment.

Step 2 See your optometrist for the eye exam. Have your health card ready. There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19.

Step 3 If required, kindergarten-aged students will receive a free pair of eyeglasses. Ask to see the frame selection available. The optometrist will order your glasses for you.

\*Free glasses are covered by a one year manufacturer's warranty.

#### Who can participate?

**Eye See...Eye Learn**™ is available to all **kindergarten-aged students** in Alberta. It's important to address eye health and vision problems before children begin school.

Children are eligible from August until they begin grade one.



#### Eye exam coverage

There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19. It's a painless, non-invasive process that could change their lives!

#### Did you know?

- 80% of learning is visual.
- 1 in 4 school-aged children has a vision problem.
- An eye exam detects health problems such as crossed eyes or lazy eye.
- Children with vision problems are often misdiagnosed as having learning or behavioural disabilities.
- The earlier an eye health or visual problem is identified, the more likely it can be corrected.
- Children often don't know they have a vision problem, as they believe what they are seeing is normal.
- It is not uncommon for parents to believe they would know if their child has a vision problem, because these issues can be hard to spot particularly if there is a problem in only one of the eyes.

#### What is an optometrist?

Your optometrist (doctor of optometry) is a primary source for all your vision, eye health and eyewear needs. They have the knowledge, tools and equipment necessary to diagnose, treat, prescribe medications or refer to a specialist, if needed.
