

#### Honoring the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation – September 30



On September 30, our school community will observe Canada's National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a time to reflect on the legacy of residential schools and honour the children, families, and communities affected.

This day is also known as Orange Shirt Day, inspired by the story of Phyllis Webstad, whose orange shirt was taken from her on her first day at a residential school. It serves as a powerful symbol of the loss, resilience, and ongoing journey toward healing and justice for Indigenous peoples.

Throughout the week, students will engage in age-appropriate learning activities that explore:

- The history and impact of residential schools
- Indigenous voices, cultures, and contributions
- The importance of reconciliation and respectful relationships

We encourage all students and staff to wear orange on September 30 to show solidarity and support. Families are invited to continue these conversations at home and explore resources that deepen understanding of Indigenous history and perspectives.

Let us walk together in the spirit of reconciliation, with open hearts and a commitment to learning.

Great minds really do think alike! Moments like these remind us that a strong school spirit (and a great sense of style!) brings us all together.






5B's Pipe Cleaner Portraits - Celebrating Our School Community!

#### Sync Your Calendar

Did you know you can sync the school calendar to your own calendar? Within seconds, your calendar will contain all SouthPointe's important dates including holidays, school-closures days, planned activities and events, and it will remain synced with all the latest updates throughout the school year.



#### Pay School Fees Online!

Wondering when and how to pay for school fees? School fee information for the 2025-26 school year will be posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal in late September. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. NOTE: Additional fees may be added throughout the year—for example, at the beginning of each semester, as your child takes part in various activities, or they may be adjusted by changes in selected optional courses in junior and senior high school. If you're unable to pay your school fees, you can apply to have certain fees waived. The application deadline is Dec. 15, 2025.

# Video Surveillance at Schools and On Buses

Did you know each EIPS bus is equipped with video surveillance, and many school sites have video monitoring equipment?

Video surveillance and equipment help:

•ensure the safety of all students, staff, drivers and property; and •discourage destructive acts.

As needed, EIPS school administration and Student Transportation staff review video recordings, in accordance with the Protection of Privacy Act. The recordings assist schools and the Division with monitoring student and driver conduct and may be used as evidence in a disciplinary matter.
