

#### Principal's Message

As we begin October, I want to thank you for your patience and support during this time of uncertainty. As you may be aware, the Alberta Teachers' Association (ATA) announced its members voted against the latest contract offer from the province. As such, ATA members across Alberta—including all teachers from Elk Island Public Schools—plan to initiate a strike involving a complete withdrawal of services starting on Oct. 6, 2025. As a result, EIPS has no choice but to close schools as of October 6. All student transportation services, EIPS activities and school extracurricular activities, including field trips; clubs; committee meetings; and sports competitions, practices and games, are also suspended until classes resume. All EIPS families should make alternate arrangements for their children throughout the strike. Childcare centres located in EIPS schools can remain open—contact the childcare provider directly for specific details.

Please note that teachers will not have access to their email or school platforms during a strike. While schools are closed to the public, our office phone lines will be answered by our office staff. ### Counsellor's Corner...

#### **Belonging & Awareness**

As we settle into the rhythm of the school year, I want to take a moment to reflect on two powerful themes that shape our school community: belonging and awareness. Belonging isn't just about fitting in—it's about feeling seen, valued, and safe to be your authentic self. When students feel a sense of belonging, they're more likely to take risks in learning, build meaningful relationships, and develop resilience. It's something we build together, through kindness, inclusion, and shared responsibility.

Awareness is the lens that helps us understand each other. It's noticing when someone is struggling, recognizing our own emotions, and being open to perspectives different from our own. Whether it's cultural awareness, emotional awareness, or awareness of learning needs, it helps us respond with empathy and intention.

This month, we're encouraging students to:

- Practice active listening and respectful dialogue
- Reach out to peers who may feel left out



#### **Municipal Election 2025: Vote October 20**

The next municipal election, which includes the election of local school board trustees, takes place on Monday, Oct. 20, 2025. It's your opportunity to get involved in public education by casting your vote for a public school trustee.

#### EIPS Trustee Election information EIPS Trustee Candidate List

Electors can cast their votes for municipal candidates—mayors, reeves, councillors, as applicable—and school board trustee candidates—public or separate. Voting stations are typically open from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Each municipality conducts the election for its residents and establishes formal voting station hours and procedures.

#### Pay School Fees Online!

School fee information for the 2025-26 school year is now posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online. If you're unable to pay your school fees, you can apply to have certain fees waived. The application deadline is Dec. 15, 2025.

NOTE: Don't forget to also log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as field trips, class projects, extracurricular activities fees and more.
